From Cold War to Hot Peace: An American Ambassador in Putin's Russia

In 2008, when Michael McFaul was invited to leave Stanford University in order to join what was viewed then as an unlikely presidential campaign, he had no idea that he would find himself at the center of one of today's most consequential international relationships. As President Barack Obama's adviser on Russian affairs, McFaul helped craft the American "reset" policy that was intended to foster a new and unprecedented collaboration between the United States and Russia. Then, as U.S. Ambassador to Russia from 2012 to 2014, he had a front row seat when this hopeful moment crumbled after Vladimir Putin's return to the presidency.



highlights from his new book, *From Cold War to Hot Peace: An American Ambassador in Putin's Russia* (Houghton Mifflin Harcourt, May 2018), a highly acclaimed account that combines history and memoir to tell the story of U.S.-Russia relations from the fall of the Soviet Union to the new rise of President Putin.

Michael McFaul is Professor of Political Science, Director of the Freeman Spogli Institute for

International Studies, and Peter and Helen Bing Senior Fellow at the Hoover Institute at Stanford University. He earned both his B.A. in International Relations and Slavic Languages and his M.A. in Soviet and East European Studies at Stanford. As a Rhodes Scholar, Professor McFaul completed his Ph.D. in International Relations at Oxford University.

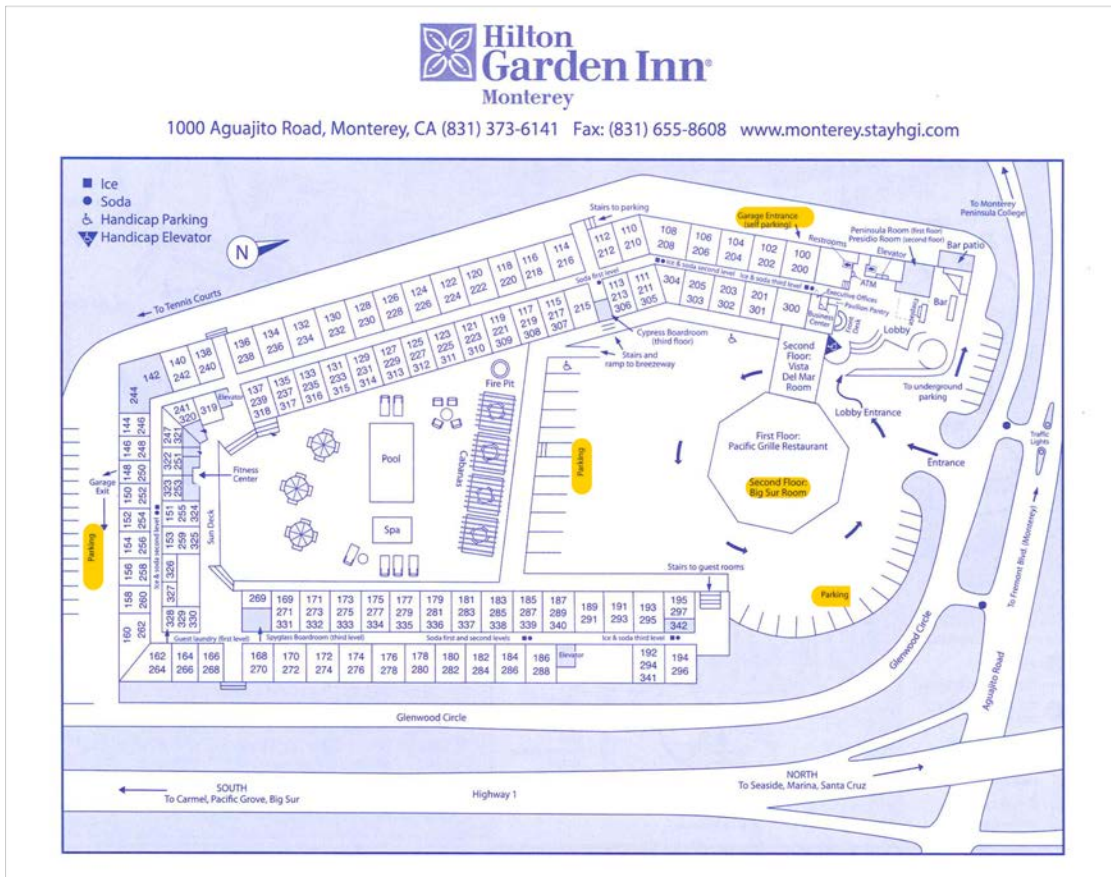

Additional Information about September's Luncheon
