The Global Economic Impact of the Invasion of Ukraine

Professor Robert Rogowsky

Middlebury Institute of International Studies at Monterey and Georgetown University

While the world's main focus since the February 2022 Russian invasion of Ukraine has been the tragic human toll and the destruction of Ukrainian territory, the war is also causing a major disruption of global economies. Professor Robert Rogowsky will discuss the ripple economic effects of the invasion, including the impact on global supply chains, cost increases,

product shortages, and catastrophic food shortages. He will also discuss how the international community is addressing these challenges.

Robert Rogowsky is a professor in the International Trade Program at the Middlebury Institute of International Studies at Monterey. He also teaches as an adjunct professor at Georgetown University's Walsh School of Foreign Service and McCourt School of Public



Policy. He is the president of the Institute for Trade and Commercial Diplomacy. Dr. Rogowsky spent nearly two decades at the US International Trade Commission, where he served as chief economist from 1995 to 1999, and as director of operations from 1991 to 2010. On many occasions, he has testified before Congress on matters involving international trade, and

has published widely on the topics of international trade, competition policy, and regulation.

Because he is currently on the East Coast, Professor Rogowsky will deliver his remarks virtually, appearing live on screen during the in-person luncheon at the Hilton Garden Inn. Don't miss this timely presentation and Q & A session! Please see page 2 for further information.

WACA Travel Program

Are you ready to get back out in the world? If so, consider taking one of the many tours offered by the *Travel the World* program, which has been run by the Philadelphia WAC for 45 years. *Travel the World* tours are led by experts in world affairs, and offer behind-the-scenes access to people and places on every continent. There are a number of tours still available for 2022. But if you'd like to plan a little further ahead, here's just a tiny taste of what's available in 2023.

- 2/10-2/24: Egypt and the Eternal Nile. The Pyramids and Sphinx, Abu Simbel, Luxor, Karnak, the Egyptian Museum: see the many wonders of the Nile Valley from ship to shore.
- 3/9-3/12: New Orleans: Remembering WWII. Explore the impressive National WWII Museum and experience the unique flavor of the Big Easy on this tour to New Orleans.
- 4/25-5/11: Along Central Asia's Silk Road. From falconry to yurt making to UNESCO World Heritage sites, this tour takes you through Kyrgyzstan, Kazakhstan, and Uzbekistan.
- 7/3-7/14: Rhine and Moselle River Cruise: A Family Journey. Begin in Switzerland, then sail through France and Germany to Amsterdam. Family excursions are offered at every port, along with onboard programs for kids and teens.
- 10/2-10/16: Vietnam and Cambodia. From Ho Chi Minh City (formerly Saigon), take a weeklong cruise on the Mekong River to Siem Reap, Cambodia.
