Looming Confrontation in the Indo-Pacific?

U.S. policymakers are increasingly focused on China's growing assertiveness and military build-up in the Indo-Pacific region. In a recent report to Congress, the Department of Defense described China's navy as the "largest navy in the world and, by far, the largest of any country in East Asia." This and other elements of China's military modernization efforts have led to deepening the U.S.-

China strategic and economic rivalry in the region. In his presentation, Professor Russell will discuss the unfolding confrontation in the Indo-Pacific. Drawing on current research he is undertaking for the U.S. Navy, he will focus on the role of the U.S. Navy in meeting this challenge.

James A. Russell serves as Associate Professor at the Naval Postgraduate School where he teaches courses on U.S. foreign policy in the Middle East, military innovation, and national security strategy. His articles and commentaries have appeared in a wide variety of media and scholarly outlets around the world. From 1988 -2001, Dr. Russell held a variety of positions in the Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense for International Security Affairs, Near East and South Asia, Department of Defense.

Professor Russell holds a Master's in Public and International Affairs from the University of Pittsburgh and a Ph.D. in War Studies from the University of London.
